| Profile | Samples for the HMDS (Haematology Malignancy Diagnostic Service) are an integral step in the diagnostic work-up and follow-up of patients with potential haematological malignancies. |
| Clinical indication | Suspected haematological malignancy |
| Specimen type | Peripheral blood (EDTA bottle) Marrow slides Marrow (EDTA bottle) Trephine (in formalin pot) |
| Sample type | As above |
| Minimum volume | 1x purple top EDTA sample |
| Special precautions | HMDS request form needs to be completed and signed by the requesting clinician. Request forms available on www.hmds.org.uk Request forms must be completed with clear and legible writing - where possible a printed addressograph label should be to the request form.
